Edgebrooke Village II Homeowners Association Architectural Guidelines



Front Yards

Trees

- Yards will keep a minimum of one (1) tree
- Dead trees will be removed & replaced
- Palm Trees to be kept trimmed & free of dead palms

General Maintenance

- Yards to remain free of toys & bicycles when not in use
- Yards to remain free of weeds, dead bushes, leaves, dead cactus & sections of it
- Trees & bushes to remain trimmed and not growing into the street or sidewalk area, making it difficult to pass on foot or car
- Yards to remain free of furniture or boxed items, unless being collected for donation, giveaway & clearly marked & in view no longer than 48 hours.
- Yards to remain free of miscellaneous debris, i.e. items not intended for yard decoration
- Yard tools to be kept out of view when not in use
- Homes with rock shall be kept swept, not spilling into sidewalk area
- Hoses shall remain reeled up when not in use
- Sidewalks & driveway need to be free of oil, or an attempt to do so
- Trash Containers to be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 p.m. the evening prior to pick up and shall be put away the day of collection

Landscaping

- Only yard/patio style furniture will be allowed in good condition
- Decorative flowers, rock, bushes, cactus do NOT require approval
- Grass shall not be permitted in the front yard

Exterior of Homes

Garage Doors

- Garage Door replacement/paint require Architectural Approval
- Color shall match the house or trim color or be white and be all one color
- Garage doors with windows are allowed
- Garage doors shall remain closed except when in use for coming/going & working within
- Garage doors shall remain operable
- Replacement panels shall be painted the same color as the rest of the door

Roof

- Roof replacements require Architectural Approval
- Only asphalt roofing is allowed
- Roof color is homeowner's choice, keeping in mind a light color is recommended for less heat absorption (keep cooling costs down).

Back Yards

- Improvements to back yards **DO NOT** require Architectural Approval
- Additions of Storage sheds, or any permanent fixture requires Architectural Approval
- Fixtures that can be seen above the fence line require Architectural Approval

Fencing & Gates

- Fence replacements/altering/additions require Architectural Approval
- Height requirement is 6 feet around the perimeter
- Width of wood slats is up to 6" wide
- Wood fences may only be stained a redwood or natural color
- Partial fence replacement must match the existing fence
- Complete enclosures to the sidewalk are not allowed
- Wrought Iron style gating is acceptable (keep in mind what is viewable through the gate, i.e., unacceptable items, trash, etc, is not allowed)
- Cinder Block fencing is only allowed if stucco'd & painted to match the house
- Brick is allowed if painted to match the house colors
- A 4 foot fence will be allowed as an additional enclosure in the front area

Outside of House

- Any alternation, upgrades to exterior of home requires Architectural Approval and most be completed in a reasonable time frame, no more than 60 days
- Stucco acceptable
- Siding replacement acceptable
- Window replacement acceptable
- Window grids, upgrades acceptable
- Window covering viewable from exterior of home must be in good condition
- Paint colors are subject to Architectural Approval, no current scheme in place
- Any fading, chipping, peeling of paint must be maintained to neighborhood standards
- Deteriorating siding, or holes in siding must be replaced or repaired
- Holiday decorations must be removed no later than 14 days beyond the holiday
- House numbers must be in place and viewable from the street
